This Position Specification is intended to provide additional information about Bon Secours Mercy Health (BSM Health) and the position of **President - Atlantic Group**. It is designed to assist qualified individuals in assessing their interest in the position. BSM Health is an Equal Opportunity Employer. BSM Health has retained Summit Talent Group to conduct this national search.

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# Position Summary

Mercy Health (Cincinnati, OH) and Bon Secours Health System (Marriottsville, MD) finalized their merger on September 5, 2018 establishing Bon Secours Mercy Health (BSMHealth), one of the largest Catholic healthcare systems in the nation: \$8b in net operating revenue, \$239m in operating income, 43 hospitals in seven states, 57,000+ employees, and 2,100+ employed physicians.

[Bon Secours Mercy Health \(BSM Health\)](#) has retained [Summit Talent Group](#) to conduct a national search for the newly created position of President - Atlantic Group (“President”). This position reports to Brian Smith, the Chief Operating Officer of BSMHealth. The President will have oversight of the Atlantic Group, with an operating revenue of approximately \$3.2B and comprised of 11 acute care hospitals & other healthcare facilities located throughout the states of Florida, Maryland, New York, South Carolina, and Virginia. The President will utilize the Marriottsville, MD campus as the Group headquarters.

In addition, the President will partner with Mark Nantz, BSM Health’s Chief Administrative Officer and interim President - Atlantic Group, to fulfill BSM Health’s governance responsibilities for the joint ventures with Roper St. Francis Healthcare (South Carolina) and Bon Secours Charity Health System, a member of the Westchester Medical Center Health Network (New York).

The President will be the executive leader for the Atlantic Group, serving as the single point of accountability for the market: operations, P&L management, strategy execution, financial health, and leadership development. The incumbent will be responsible for confirming that the system enterprise strategy is understood and effectively implemented throughout the Atlantic Group and is in alignment with the organization’s mission, values & core culture.

The President will be a visible and mobile leader, skilled at working in a fully integrated operating model with mature shared service functions. The incumbent will

thrive in a growth oriented, scalable-ready infrastructure, prepared to: compete for patients, address disparity in the markets, and make the case to invest capital as success is achieved. In short, the President will adroitly balance the needs of the physicians, acute facilities, ambulatory operations, population health/clinically integrated networks, as well as emerging and innovative consumer-based delivery services.

Critical to success is a leader that has the strategic intent, intuition and bias for action to move the organization forward, demonstrating well refined critical thinking and team building skills that drive exceptional physician & employee engagement, patient experience and a culture of high reliability with sustainable outcomes.

The ideal candidate will have earned a master's degree with 15 years of senior operations acute healthcare leadership experience, in complex and geographically dispersed health system. Additional expertise in finance, business development and strategy are highly valued.

The President will live (fully relocate) within the “footprint” of the Atlantic Group geography: Baltimore, MD; Washington DC; Northern, VA; Richmond, VA; Hampton Roads, VA; Greenville, SC and/or Cincinnati, OH. The expectation is that the President will spend approximately one week a month in Cincinnati, OH; one week a month in Marriottsville, MD; and two weeks a month traveling throughout the Atlantic Group locations.


**TIMELINE** – Summit Talent Group will present the final candidate slate in December 2018, with the first-round interviews with BSMHealth leaders via video in January 2019. 

# A COMMUNITY OF CARE



## ABOUT OUR COMMUNITY: **BALTIMORE, MARYLAND**

Known for its scenic, world-renowned Inner Harbor, distinct neighborhoods, museums, and of course, crab houses, Baltimore is Maryland's largest city and economic hub.

The city is rich with history. A major seafaring and trading community located on the Chesapeake Bay, Baltimore played an important role in events that shaped the nation's history. During the War of 1812, Baltimore's Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine – a popular tourist destination – was the birthplace of our national anthem, the "Star Spangled Banner."

The city is home to the Baltimore Orioles baseball team, the Baltimore Ravens football team, and the Baltimore Blast indoor soccer team. Baltimore also hosts the Preakness Stakes, the middle jewel of horse racing's "Triple Crown."

The city is not without its challenges. It struggles with escalating crime, high rates of homicide, substance abuse, poverty, chronic disease and a mortality rate that ranks last on key health outcomes compared to other areas of the state. In April 2015, unrest erupted after Freddie Gray, a 25-year-old African American resident, was arrested in west Baltimore and later died after sustaining injuries to his neck and spine while being transported in a police vehicle. Police and community relationships have struggled as a result.

West Baltimore, where Bon Secours Hospital is located has a population of 25,487 of which 52.3% are women, 47.7% are men and 19% are African American. The average adjusted income is \$25,667 compared to \$72,703 for the state. When these statistics are combined with the challenges of crime, drugs, chronic disease and poverty; it's easy to see there is much opportunity for improvement. Local organizations, including Bon Secours, have been steadily working to transform blighted areas of West Baltimore into clean, safe communities.

## SERVICES

The Sisters of Bon Secours first began their work in the United States in Baltimore, Maryland, arriving in 1881 and providing home care to the sick and dying in the city. The Sisters built **Bon Secours Hospital** in 1919 and over the years as the needs of the city changed, the hospital's services have changed. The hospital focuses on acute care. The 69-bed facility provides acute inpatient and outpatient services, renal, a 24-hour emergency department, inpatient behavioral health, corrections ministry, a primary care facility and pastoral care. Bon Secours' approach to community health reaches far beyond the traditional model of health care. With community partners, Bon Secours owns and operates more than 720 apartment units in west Baltimore for low- and moderate-income seniors, families and people with disabilities. **Bon Secours Community Works** is the community outreach arm of Bon Secours Baltimore. The ministry at Community Works is to enrich west Baltimore communities with programs and services that contribute to the long-term economic and social viability of the neighborhoods that surround the hospital. Community Works provides:



- **COMMUNITY WORKS FAMILY SUPPORT CENTER** – Provides services to pregnant mothers and families with children up to age three, offering Early Head Start services, GED preparation, developmental child care, parenting classes, career development, eviction prevention, financial counseling, and tax services


- **WOMEN'S RESOURCE CENTER** – A daytime drop-in center where women who are struggling with a range of life challenges can find relief and help.

- **YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND CAREER AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT** – These two career development programs help teens and adults with job-readiness skills, job placement, and career development.

- **CLEAN & GREEN LANDSCAPING AND AN URBAN FARM** – Trains local workers to transform vacant lots in West Baltimore into green, well-maintained, usable spaces and then helps them find landscaping jobs. Fresh vegetables are grown at the Urban Farm. The produce is distributed in west Baltimore, which is located in a food desert.

- **RE-ENTRY PROGRAM** – Offers case management, record expungement, career coaching and a 12-week course for ex-offenders to help build skills and set them on a path to success.

- **FINANCIAL SERVICES** – Our Money Place offers services to help residents become more financially aware, begin building assets, and create stronger financial futures for their families.

## ABOUT OUR COMMUNITY: HUDSON VALLEY, NEW YORK — SUFFERN, WARWICK AND PORT JERVIS

Known for its lush greenery, mountain ranges, and cultural attractions, the Hudson Valley is a region in New York that runs 150 miles from the tip of Manhattan to Albany, the state's capital. Orange and Rockland counties are at the southern part of the valley and border New Jersey.

**Rockland County**, which sits on the Hudson River just 30 miles north of New York City, has plentiful scenic river views and opportunities for outdoor recreation in the Ramapo Mountains. The county is also known for its villages, including **Suffern**. Incorporated in 1796, Suffern is a gateway to the Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area.

**Orange County** sits about 50 miles north of New York City. It is home to some of the state's major attractions, including West Point, the United States Military Academy. The town of **Warwick**, which is located in the southwest part of the county, was founded in 1788. It is the largest municipality in Orange County.



**Port Jervis** is located in western Orange County, at the junction of New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Port Jervis has a long history as a transportation center, initially serving as a stop for the first 100-mile road in America and then as a port on the Delaware and Hudson Canal and a division center for New York and Lake Erie Railroad.

**Bon Secours Charity Health System** operates three hospitals in the Hudson Valley, in Suffern, Port Jervis, and Warwick, as well as long term care and assisted living facilities, and home care and hospice care.

## SERVICES

Bon Secours Charity Health System's three hospitals were all founded in the early 20th century as small, rural hospitals that have grown with the population. The Sisters of Charity of St. Elizabeth opened **Good Samaritan Hospital** in 1902 with just seven beds in the village of Suffern. The hospital now has 308 beds and provides a wide range of specialty services, including cardiac surgery, maternity and newborn services, psychiatric, renal dialysis, and radiation oncology. Good Samaritan Home Care has grown into one of the largest home care programs in New York.

**Bon Secours Community Hospital** was originally constructed in 1923 by the Sisters of the Poor of St. Francis. In 1956, the Sisters of Mercy took over the management of the hospital. The hospital now operates 168 beds for medical/surgical services. St. Joseph's Place, a 46-bed skilled nursing unit, is also housed within the hospital.

**Saint Anthony Community Hospital** was founded in 1939 by the Sisters of the Poor of St. Francis in Warwick. Today the hospital has 73 inpatient beds along with emergency, medical, surgical, obstetrical/gynecological and acute care services. Mount Alverno Center, an assisted living facility, and Schervier Pavilion, a 120-bed skilled nursing facility, are located on the St. Anthony campus.

In 1996, the Sisters of Charity joined the Franciscan Sisters of the Poor, the Sisters of Mercy, and the Franciscan Health System to form the Tri-State Health System. In 2000, Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center and the Sisters of Charity entered into a co-sponsorship with the Sisters of Bon Secours, creating Bon Secours Charity Health System. In 2015, Bon Secours finalized a Joint Venture under which Westchester Medical Center, Valhalla, New York, became the majority co-member in Bon Secours Charity and took over management of the system.

## ABOUT OUR COMMUNITY: **GREENVILLE, SOUTH CAROLINA**

Nestled in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains, Greenville sits in the heart of South Carolina's Upcountry, about halfway between Charlotte, North Carolina and Atlanta, Georgia. With a population of more than 65,000, the city is known for its art galleries and museums, restaurants, unique shops, and many outdoor activities.

Once known as the "Textile Capital of the World," Greenville's rich history can still be seen today through historic sites and museums. The Upcountry History Museum, a Smithsonian affiliate, includes exhibits detailing three centuries of upstate South Carolina history, while the nearby Hagood Mill Historic Site and Folklife Center is home to living history demonstrations and one of the oldest known surviving gristmills still producing grain products in the state.

Outdoor entertainment is also easy to find in Greenville. Popular spots include Falls Park on the Reedy, a downtown park filled with waterfalls, gardens, and public art, and the Swamp Rabbit Trail – a 21-mile, multi-use trail system that runs along the Reedy River.



Each May, the Artisphere festival brings nearly 100,000 people downtown for art demonstrations, live music, culinary experiences, dance, and theater. The Peace Center hosts nationally acclaimed Broadway shows, and the Bon Secours Wellness Arena hosts some of the biggest names in entertainment.

Bon Secours serves the Greenville region with two hospitals (St. Francis Downtown and St. Francis Eastside), two ambulatory surgery centers, home health, hospice, and several outpatient centers.

## SERVICES

Bon Secours St. Francis was originally founded in 1921 as the Emma Booth Memorial Hospital. The Franciscan Sisters of the Poor acquired the hospital in 1932 and constructed a new St. Francis Hospital (now St. Francis Downtown) in 1971. St. Francis Women’s Hospital opened in 1990; it is now called St. Francis Eastside. In 2000, St. Francis Health System transferred sponsorship to Bon Secours. Besides the two hospitals, Bon Secours St. Francis operates two outpatient surgery centers, a cancer center, home care, and inpatient hospice. Today, Bon Secours St. Francis operates two hospitals – the 245-bed St. Francis Downtown, and the 93-bed St. Francis Eastside. They offer a full range of services. St. Francis Eastside continues its traditional focus on labor and delivery, neonatal care, and women’s services, but also offers other specialties including orthopedic and bariatric surgery.

Named after a long-time local teacher who became the first African-American to serve as chair of the St. Francis Board, this center brings the most advanced breast imaging technology available together in one place with compassionate, convenient care and rapid results.

Located on Greenville’s eastside, this ambulatory surgery center offers orthopedics, podiatry, oral surgery, plastic surgery, general surgery, gynecological surgery and ear, nose, throat procedures.

Located in southeast Virginia where the James, Nansemond, and Elizabeth rivers pour into the mouth of the Chesapeake Bay, the Hampton Roads area is home to more than 1.6 million people. It is one of the world's largest natural harbors and has a large military presence. Among the first regions of Virginia settled in the colonial era, the Hampton Roads area now includes eight cities which are connected by a network of tunnels, bridges, and ferries, including Chesapeake, Hampton, Newport News, Norfolk, Portsmouth, Suffolk, Virginia Beach, and Williamsburg.

The area is home to a range of historic attractions, including Colonial Williamsburg, the Jamestown Settlement, and the Yorktown Battlefield, where the British surrendered at the end of the American Revolution. Military installations include Joint Air Force/Army Base Langley-Eustis in Newport News, Naval Station Norfolk, and Naval Air Station Oceana in Virginia Beach. Virginia Beach is also well-known for its boardwalk and oceanfront.

Bon Secours serves the Hampton Roads region with three owned hospitals, one joint venture hospital, a psychiatric hospital, two assisted living facilities, two skilled nursing facilities, home care and hospice services, and numerous outpatient centers.

## SERVICES

The Hampton Roads market encompasses the southeastern part of Bon Secours' Virginia region. Bon Secours assumed the sponsorship of Maryview Medical Center in 1984 and also operates a 54-bed psychiatric hospital on the Maryview campus. On November 1, 1996, through a joint venture arrangement with the Bernardine Franciscan Sisters, Mary Immaculate Hospital became a member of Bon Secours Health System. That same day, Bon Secours assumed sponsorship of DePaul Medical Center, the oldest Catholic public hospital in Virginia (founded in 1856). In 2011, Sentara Princess Anne Hospital, a joint venture between Bon Secours and Sentara, opened in Virginia Beach.

Two Hampton Roads hospitals are Magnet-certified for nursing excellence. The system is known for its cardiac care, cancer services, orthopedics, weight loss program, and In Motion physical therapy services. There are also two assisted living facilities, two skilled nursing facilities, and home care and home hospice programs. Two outpatient centers – Bon Secours HealthCenter at Harbour View and Bon Secours Health Center at Virginia Beach – offer

a wide range of ambulatory services, including a freestanding emergency department at Harbour View.

The system is active in community health initiatives, including the award-winning East Ocean View Community Health Initiative, the Care-A-Van (a free mobile medical service), and Bon Secours Maryview Foundation Healthcare Center, a free clinic in Portsmouth.

The Medical Group's 175 providers at over 75 locations offer a full spectrum of care.

### BON SECOURS CANCER INSTITUTE

Bon Secours and other partner organizations focused efforts to improve the small community of East Ocean View, where crime and poverty were high and access to healthy, fresh foods, and primary health care services were low or nonexistent. The combination led to hypertension, heart disease, obesity and diabetes. The initiative created a food pantry, a community garden; events offering free groceries, hot meals, health screenings, and information on fitness, nutrition, and weight loss.

The project received the 2016 NOVA Award from the American Hospital Association for innovative collaborations that help bring better health to the community.

### RICHMOND, VIRGINIA



Founded in 1607, the city of Richmond is not only Virginia's capital – it is the strategic center of commerce, innovation, and decision-making power in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Richmond sits two hours south of Washington D.C. and has a population of about 220,000. Visitors can go from busy downtown streets to farm land and expansive state park trails within a matter of minutes.

The Richmond region is a hotspot for history lovers, given its ties to the Revolutionary War, the Civil War, and the civil rights movement. Among the favorite spots: The Virginia Capitol, designed by Thomas Jefferson; St. John's Church, where visitors can watch reenactors revive the Second Continental Congress made famous by Patrick Henry's "Give Me Liberty, Or Give Me Death" speech;

Robert E. Lee's 1862 headquarters (now the Dabbs House Museum); and the American Civil War Museum.

The Richmond market encompasses the northern part of Bon Secours' Virginia region. In 1966, the Sisters of Bon Secours opened St. Mary's Hospital in Richmond. In 1995, Richmond Community Hospital joined Bon Secours, and three years later, Memorial Regional Medical Center opened in the Hanover community. Bon Secours opened St. Francis Medical Center south of the James River in 2005. In 2014, Bon Secours acquired Rappahannock General Hospital on the Northern Neck. Today the system is one of the area's largest employers. Three Richmond hospitals are Magnet-certified for nursing excellence. The system is active in community health initiatives, including the Care-A-Van, a mobile medical service that offers free primary care to uninsured adults and children at 21 different locations.

## ABOUT OUR COMMUNITY:

### ST. PETERSBURG, FLORIDA

St. Petersburg was founded in 1888 by a land speculator and a railway owner, who tossed a coin to decide who would name the town. The winner named the land after his hometown of Saint Petersburg, Russia. Located on Florida's Gulf Coast about 20 miles outside of Tampa, St. Petersburg is home to more than 250,000 people and is the fourth most populous city in Florida. St. Petersburg is located on a peninsula between Tampa Bay and the Gulf of Mexico, and is connected to mainland Florida to the north. Due to its good weather and low cost of living, the city has long been a popular retirement destination.

Not surprisingly, tourists are also attracted to the "Sunshine City" with an average 360 days of sunshine each year, art and restaurant scene, sport fishing, and award-winning beaches. St. Pete Beach, with its white, powdery sand, includes the longest undeveloped stretch of public beach in the county and plenty of watersports opportunities. Just north of St. Pete Beach is Clearwater Beach, named number one on Trip Advisor's Top Beaches for 2018.

Major League Baseball's Tampa Bay Rays play at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, and professional football, hockey, and soccer teams also call the Tampa-St. Pete area home. The world-renowned Salvador Dali Museum features the Spanish surrealist's largest collection of works outside of Spain. Fort De Soto Park, made up of five interconnected islands, is the largest park in the county.

Bon Secours serves the Tampa-St. Petersburg region with a skilled nursing and rehabilitation center, an assisted living facility, and a home health agency with two locations.

## SERVICES

On June 16, 1963, a brand new “convalescent home” called Florida Care of St. Petersburg opened to much fanfare. A for-profit facility, it changed ownership several times until the Catholic Diocese of St. Petersburg purchased the home in 1975 and converted it to a non-profit, Catholic skilled nursing facility. Then, in 1988, the diocese found the Sisters of Bon Secours and their newly-formed health care system, Bon Secours Health System, to take over the facility, now called Maria Manor.

**Bon Secours Maria Manor Nursing and Rehabilitation Center** is a 274-resident nursing care center offering skilled and long-term nursing care and short-term rehabilitation services. The Center for Rehabilitation at Maria Manor is designed for those with short-term rehabilitation needs. This 32-bed dedicated short-term unit is a separate and dedicated unit designed for those individuals who no longer require acute hospital care but are unable to return home without additional care and services.



In November of 2000, **Bon Secours Place**, an assisted living facility licensed for 105 residents, was added to the campus. The facility includes 36 suites dedicated to specialized care for those with Alzheimer’s and related diseases. Bon Secours Place offers residents as much independence as they want with the knowledge that personal care and support services are available if they need them. This facility offers residents assistance with basic activities of daily living such as bathing, grooming, dressing, and more. Bon Secours Place is the only Catholic assisted living facility in Pinellas County.

The most recent addition to the continuum of senior services within Bon Secours St. Petersburg Health System is **Bon Secours Home Care**. Established in 2006, Bon Secours Home Care serves residents in Pinellas, Pasco, and most recently, Hillsborough and Manatee counties. Working closely with primary care physicians, patients are

supported to achieve a speedy recovery from surgeries and acute illnesses, and management for unstable long term or chronic illnesses, such as diabetes, Alzheimer’s, dementia, pulmonary diseases, and arthritis.

## HEALTHY COMMUNITY INITIATIVES



### Healthy Bucs

Bon Secours supports the city’s Healthy Bucs program which supports efforts to reduce obesity and promote good nutrition and physical activity through local farmers’ markets and YMCA and community center activity.



### Healthy St. Petersburg Initiative

Bon Secours partners with other community leaders in the Healthy St. Petersburg Initiative to plan, promote, and implement programs to engage citizens and improve health outcomes. The initiative supports healthy living, playing, shopping, and eating.

### Community Gardens

Bon Secours supports Jordan Park Community Garden, located in a public housing community. The garden is maintained by volunteers and residents. Bon Secours also supports the Edible Patch Community Gardens which are set up in schools with a large population of children eligible for the free and reduced cost lunch program. The program involves schoolchildren in planting and maintaining the garden and includes education about healthy eating habits.



### 2020 Task Force/Wrap Around Program

Bon Secours participates in a grassroots coalition working toward a collective action plan for economic, social, and spiritual renewal in St. Petersburg. The coalition supports implementation of the Pinellas County 2020 Plan through churches, faith-based organizations, and other non-profits that work with 8,000 men, women, grandparents, and youth in areas such as ex-offender re-entry support, academic enrichment, delinquency diversion, employment, health services, and more. It supports the Wrap Around Program, which is designed to help families exit poverty by completing career skill training or certifications in order to equip themselves for a new, or better paying job.

## ABOUT OUR COMMUNITY: **CHARLESTON, SOUTH CAROLINA**



Founded in 1670, Charleston is South Carolina's oldest and largest city, with a population of more than 134,000. It is also a port city, located in the southern part of the state between the Cooper and Ashley rivers.

Charleston is known for its harbor, historic charm, well-preserved architecture, cobblestone streets, and Southern hospitality. You don't have to go far to find historic sites, homes, plantations, and gardens detailing the city's early days. Among the most popular spots: Fort Sumter, where the American Civil War started in April 1861. The fort sits on an island at the entrance to Charleston Harbor and is only accessible by boat.

The city's museums also give some insight into the area's past. The Charleston Museum, founded in 1773, is among the nation's oldest museums and marks the official start to the city's "Museum Mile" — a one-mile section of Meeting Street that includes everything from museums and nationally renowned historic homes to scenic parks and a Revolutionary War powder magazine.

## SERVICES



Founded in 1829, the congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy cared for the sick, orphaned, and imprisoned in Charleston, South Carolina. The Sisters opened St. Francis Xavier Infirmary in 1882, the first Catholic hospital in the state.

Over 100 years later in 1989, the sisters transferred St. Francis Xavier Hospital to the Sisters of Bon Secours. A replacement facility, **Bon Secours St. Francis Hospital**, was constructed in 1996. A year later, Bon Secours and Roper Hospital, a rival hospital, formed a joint venture called **Roper St. Francis Healthcare**. Atrium Health, a non-profit company that operates other facilities in South Carolina, holds a minority share and manages the joint venture.

Roper St. Francis Healthcare opened **Mount Pleasant Hospital** in 2010, and expects to open **Berkeley Hospital** in 2019. Roper St. Francis' three hospitals offer a full range of services, including specialties in heart and vascular, orthopedics, women's health, bariatrics and weight loss surgery, oncology, and neuroscience, including a research institute for Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS). Home care and hospice services are also provided.

### ROPER ST. FRANCIS PHYSICIAN PARTNERS

Roper St. Francis Physician Partners is a comprehensive network of more than 230 physicians that covers a complete range of primary care and 18 subspecialties.

### ROPER REHABILITATION HOSPITAL

Housed within Roper Hospital, Roper Rehabilitation Hospital is a 52-bed inpatient rehabilitation unit.

### ROPER HOSPITAL – BERKELEY

This ambulatory care facility offers a freestanding emergency department, outpatient surgery, sleep lab, and imaging and lab services.

### ROPER ST. FRANCIS CANCER CENTER

Located on the campus of Bon Secours St. Francis Hospital, the cancer center provides infusion therapy and chemotherapy, radiation therapy, and a healing boutique. Cyberknife treatment and blood and bone marrow transplant services are available at Roper hospital.

### ROPER ST. FRANCIS EYE CENTER

The Roper St. Francis Eye Center is devoted to the surgical treatment of eye disease and vision correction.
